12 Super-Camouflaged Animals You Need to Know by Nancy Furstinger - Features 12 super-camouflaged animals found around the world. Each spread contains fascinating facts, life cycle and habitat information, and interesting traits that help each animal camouflage itself.

Animal Disguises by Belinda Weber - Explains how animals use camouflage to help them hunt for food or hide from predators.

Camouflage by Terry L. Jennings - Shows different animals and their camouflaging.

Biggest, Baddest Book of Sea Creatures by Jen Schoeller – Kids can dive into unknown territory and go on an adventure through the world's oceans in the Biggest, Baddest Book of Sea Creatures.
